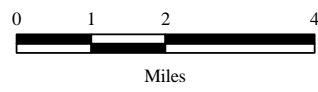

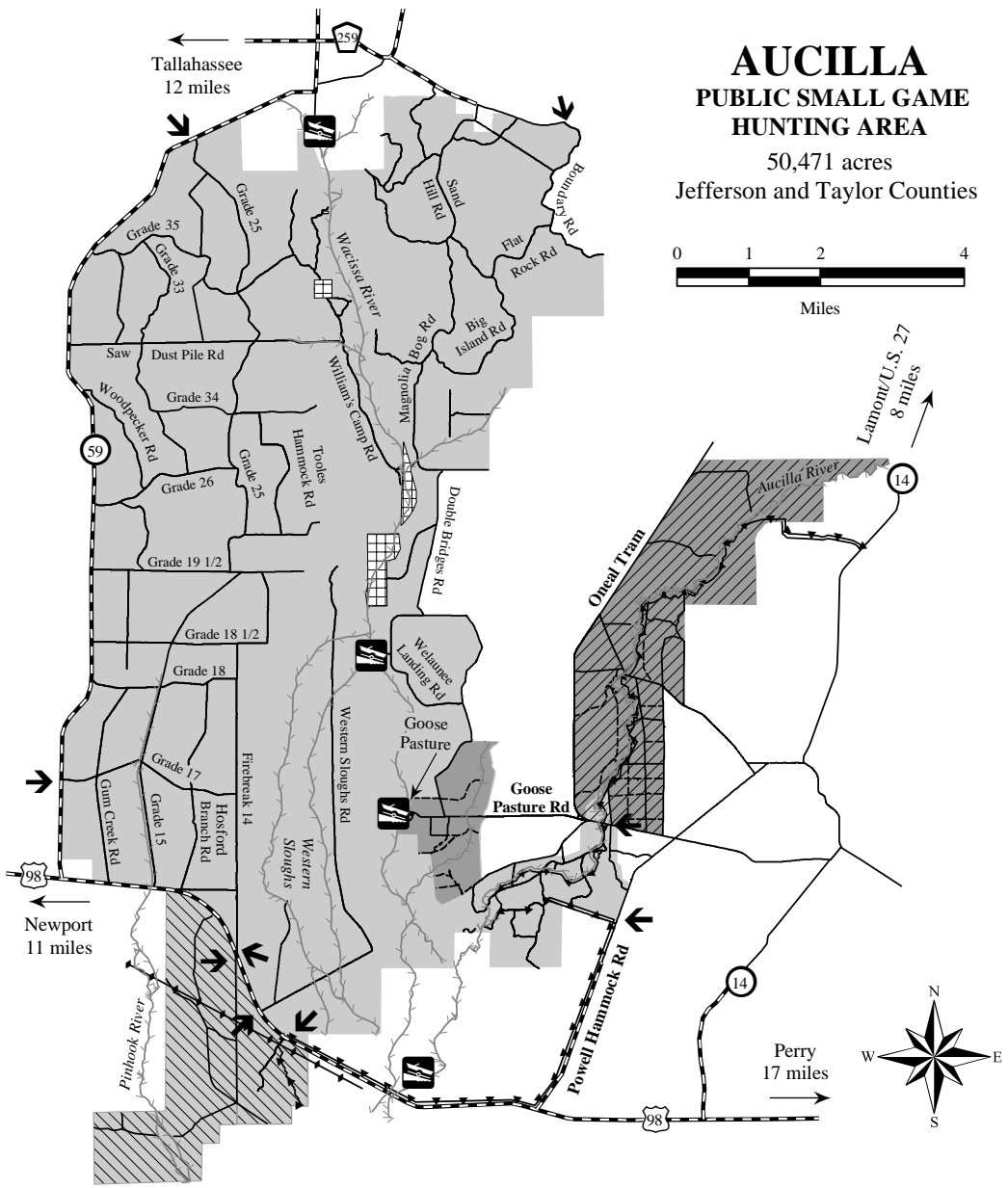

This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Aucilla Public Small Game Hunting Area. Area users should familiarize themselves with all regulations. For exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code, on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure, the Florida Hunting Regulations handbook and quota permit worksheets should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities. These publications are available from any Commission office, county tax collector and at MyFWC.com.

PERMIT, STAMP AND LICENSE INFORMATION:

Persons using public small game hunting areas are required to have appropriate licenses, permits and stamps. The following persons are exempt from all license and permit requirements (except for quota permits when listed as "no exemptions"): Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older; residents who possess a Florida Resident Disabled Person Hunting and Fishing Certificate; residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida, while home on leave for 30 days or less, upon submission of orders; and children under 16 years of age. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 and 16 years of age or older must have passed a Commission-approved hunter-safety course prior to being issued a hunting license, except the Hunter Safety Mentoring exemption allows anyone to purchase a hunting license and hunt under the supervision of a licensed hunter, 21 years of age or older, for one year. Licenses and permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, license agents, at MyFWC.com/license or by telephone at 1-888-486-8356.

QUOTA PERMIT INFORMATION: Quota permits are not required for the hunts on this area.

PUBLIC SMALL GAME HUNTING AREA REGULATIONS:

All general laws and regulations relating to wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life shall apply unless specifically exempted for this area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons, and in accordance with the following regulations:

1. Taking or attempting to take any game with the aid of live decoys, set guns, net, trap, snare, drug or poison is prohibited.
2. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this area.
3. Driving a metal object into any tree, or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven, is prohibited.
4. No person shall cut, damage or remove any natural, man-made or cultural resource without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
5. The wanton and willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.
6. Hunting, fishing or trapping is prohibited on any portion of the area posted as closed to those activities.
7. People, dogs, vehicles and other recreational equipment are prohibited in areas posted as "Closed to Public Access" by FWC administrative action.
8. Taking or herding wildlife from any motorized vehicle, aircraft or boat, which is under power is prohibited until power, and movement from that power, has ceased.
9. The release of any animal is prohibited, without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
10. Wild hog may not be transported alive.
11. Littering is prohibited.
12. Fires are prohibited.

13. A Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat, in accordance with law.
14. Digging into or disturbance of archaeological sites or removal of artifacts is prohibited.

PUBLIC ACCESS AND VEHICLES:

1. Open to public access, except access is prohibited in that portion of the still hunt area north of Goose Pasture Road and east of Oneal Tram from 1½ hours after sunset until 1½ hours before sunrise.
2. Vehicles may be operated only on named or numbered roads and shall enter and exit at designated entrances (see map).
3. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of any wildlife management area that has been designated as closed to vehicular traffic. Motorcycles may only be operated on roads open to other motor vehicles.
4. Use of all-terrain vehicles is prohibited.
5. Parked vehicles may not obstruct a road, gate or firelane.
6. A marked footpath called the Florida Trail traverses the area. This trail is open to hikers throughout the year.

HUNTERS AND CHECK STATIONS:

1. Hunting equipment and dogs may be taken onto the WMA after 8 a.m. the day before the opening of a season and shall be removed by 6 p.m. one day after the end of the season.
2. Hunters must enter and exit the Pinhook still hunt area at designated entrances.

GUNS:

1. The display or use of a gun in a manner capable of taking wildlife on or from the rights-of-way of U.S. 98 and State Road 59 is prohibited.
2. All firearms shall be securely encased and in a vehicle, vessel, camper or tent, during periods when they are not a legal method of take. Persons in possession of a valid Concealed Weapon or Firearm License may carry concealed handguns.
3. Target practice is prohibited.
4. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.
5. No person shall have a gun under control while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
6. Fully automatic or silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices and set guns are prohibited.

DOGS:

1. Hunting with dogs is prohibited in the still hunt areas.
2. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of wildlife by the use of dogs is prohibited.
3. Dogs on leashes may be used for trailing wounded game.
4. For purposes other than hunting, dogs are allowed but must be kept under physical restraint at all times.

CAMPING:

1. Only primitive camping (tents only) is allowed and only at designated sites along the Florida Trail or by permit from the Suwannee River Water Management District (SRWMD) on District-managed lands.

2. Camping is allowed at the Goose Pasture campground. For more information, contact the Suwannee River Water Management District at 386-362-1001.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS: Wild hog - No size or bag limit.

WILD HOG-DOG SEASON:

May 13-15, June 10-12, July 8-10, August 12-14 and September 9-11, 2011.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Hunting license and management area permit.

Legal to Take - Wild hog.

Regulations Unique to the Wild Hog-dog Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunts begin at 12:01 a.m. Friday morning and end at midnight Sunday evening.
2. Wild hog may be hunted with dogs during the day or at night by the aid of a light with a firearm provided that at night no such firearm shall be loaded at any time except immediately prior to the shooting of a bayed hog. The hunting of wild hog under this provision by display or use of a light from a moving vehicle, boat or animal is prohibited.

SUWANNEE RIVER WMD RULES:

Public access on District-managed lands is only allowed from 1½ hours before sunrise until 1½ hours after sunset, except by persons possessing a Special Use Authorization from the Suwannee River Water Management District.

COOPERATION REQUESTED:
