This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Green Swamp Wildlife Management Area. **Regulations that are new or differ substantially from last year are shown in bold print.** Area users should familiarize themselves with all regulations. For exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code, on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure, the Florida Hunting Regulations handbook, and quota permit worksheets should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities. These publications are available from any Commission office, county tax collector and at MyFWC.com.

Persons using wildlife management areas are required to have appropriate licenses, permits and stamps. The following persons are exempt from all license and permit requirements (except for quota permits when listed as "no exemptions", recreational use permits, antlerless deer permits and the Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp [federal duck stamp]): Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older; residents who possess a Florida Resident Disabled Person Hunting and Fishing Certificate; residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida, while home on leave for 30 days or less, upon submission of orders; and children under 16 years of age. Children under 16 years of age are exempt from the federal duck stamp. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 and 16 years of age or older must have passed a Commission-approved hunter-safety course prior to being issued a hunting license, except the Hunter Safety Mentoring exemption allows anyone to purchase a hunting license and hunt under the supervision of a licensed hunter, 21 years of age or older, for one year.

Licenses and permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, license agents, at MyFWC.com/license or by telephone at 1-888-486-8356. A no-cost Migratory Bird Permit is available when purchasing a hunting license. Any waterfowl hunter 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp; available where hunting licenses are sold, at most post offices or at duckstamp.com.

QUOTA PERMIT INFORMATION:

Archery - 750, no-cost, daily quota permits are available first-come, first-served at the check station each day of the season.

General Gun (first 9 days) - 750, no-cost, quota permits for each of 2 hunts.

General Gun (after first 9 days) - 750, no-cost, daily quota permits are available first-come, first-served at the check station each day of the season.

Small Game - 150, no-cost, daily quota permits are available first-come, first-served at the check station each day of the season.

Wild Hog-dog - 135 (first 4 days) and 160 (last 4 days), no-cost, quota permits (no exemptions).

Spring Turkey (first 2 days) - 200, no-cost, spring turkey quota permits.

Spring Turkey (after first 2 days) - 200, no-cost, daily quota permits are available first-come, first-served at the check station each day of the season.

Refer to the CAMPING section for information related to camping permits.

Permit applications: Hunters must submit electronic applications for quota and special-opportunity permits through the Commission's Total Licensing System (TLS). Worksheets listing hunts, application periods, deadlines and instructions are available at county tax collector's offices, FWC offices or MyFWC.com. Quota application periods occur throughout the year beginning April 1; please refer to the hunting handbook or MyFWC.com for specific dates. Worksheets will be available about 2 weeks prior to each application period.

Guest hunters: For each non-transferable archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun, wild hog, spring turkey and mobility-impaired quota permit issued through the Commission's TLS, only one guest permit may be obtained. The following persons may be a guest hunter, but are not required to obtain a guest permit: a youth under 16 years of age, a youth supervisor, a mentor license holder or a mentor license supervisor. A quota permit holder (host) may only bring 1 guest hunter at a time. The following persons are not considered to be guest hunters: other quota permit holders, non-hunters and exempt hunters (on areas and during seasons that allow exemptions). The host must share the bag limit with the guest and the host is responsible for violations that exceed the bag limit. The guest and host must enter and exit the area together and must share a street-legal vehicle while hunting on the area. The guest may only hunt while the host is on the area. A person is only eligible for one guest permit per hunt. Guest permits may only be obtained from license agents or county tax collector's offices. Guest permits may be obtained up to and during the last day of the hunt. Refer to the quota hunt worksheets for additional information.

Youth and mentor license holders: A youth hunter (less than 16 years of age) must be supervised by a person at least 18 years of age. A mentor license holder must be supervised by a licensed hunter at least 21 years of age. Unless exempt, only those supervisors with proper licenses and permits may hunt. If the supervisor is hunting during any hunt (not including special-opportunity) for which quota permits are issued, at least one person in the party must be in possession of a quota permit. During a hunt that allows exemptions, a non-exempt supervisor of a youth must have a quota permit to hunt. A non-hunting supervisor is allowed to accompany a youth or mentor license holder during any hunt (including special-opportunity).

Transfer of permits: Quota and guest permits are not transferable. Except for youth under 16 years of age, a positive form of identification is required when using a non-transferable permit. The sale or purchase of any quota permit or guest permit is prohibited.

GENERAL AREA REGULATIONS:

All general laws and regulations relating to wildlife and fish shall apply unless specifically exempted for this area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons and in accordance with the following regulations:

1. Any person hunting deer or accompanying another person hunting deer shall wear at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material as an outer garment, above the waistline. These provisions are not required when hunting with a bow and arrow during archery season.

2. Taking of spotted fawn, swimming deer or roasted turkey is prohibited. Species legal to hunt are listed under each season.
3. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this area.
4. Driving a metal object into any tree, or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven, is prohibited.
5. No person shall cut, damage or remove any natural, man-made or cultural resource without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
6. Taking or attempting to take any game with the aid of live decoys, recorded game calls or sounds, set guns, artificial light, net, trap, snare, drug or poison is prohibited. Recorded calls and sounds can be used to hunt furbearers, wild hog and crows.
7. The wanton and willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.
8. Hunting, fishing or trapping is prohibited on any portion of the area posted as closed to those activities.
9. People, dogs, vehicles and other recreational equipment are prohibited in areas posted as "Closed to Public Access" by FWC administrative action.
10. Taking or herding wildlife from any motorized vehicle, aircraft or boat which is under power is prohibited, until power and movement from that power, has ceased.
11. Most game may be hunted from ½ hour before sunrise until ½ hour after sunset (see exceptions for each season).
12. The release of any animal is prohibited, without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
13. The head and evidence of sex may not be removed from the carcass of any deer or turkey on the area.
14. The planting or introduction of any non-native plant is prohibited, without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
15. Wild hog may not be transported alive.
16. Littering is prohibited.
17. It is unlawful to set fire to any forest, grass or woodlands.
18. A Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat, in accordance with law.
19. Falconers may hunt during the statewide falconry season anytime a management area is open for public access. Falconers are not exempt from quota permits during hunts requiring them.
20. The possession or consumption of intoxicating beverages is prohibited.

PUBLIC ACCESS AND VEHICLES:

1. Open to public access year round. Public access is limited to foot traffic and bicycles only, except during periods open for scouting or hunting, the May 5 - June 17 (Saturdays and Sundays only) fishing and frogging season and when camping is allowed.
2. Except at designated campsites, vehicles may only be operated on the area from 1½ hours before sunrise until 1½ hours after sunset during establishing hunting seasons, and from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. one day prior to archery, general gun and spring turkey hunts. During the fishing and frogging season, vehicles may be operated during daylight hours only.
3. Vehicle access to designated campsites is allowed after 8 a.m. one day prior to archery, general gun and spring turkey hunts until 1½ hours after sunset on the last day of the hunt. During small game, wild hog-dog, and the fishing and frogging seasons, vehicle access to designated campsites is allowed after 4 p.m. on Fridays until 1½ hours after sunset Sundays.
4. Vehicles may be operated only on named roads, except Stanley Fish Hole, Orange Lake and Tillman Lake roads are open only during the fishing and frogging season.
5. Stanley Fish Hole, Orange Lake and Tillman Lake roads will be open to vehicular traffic during the May-June fishing season. Tanic Grade, Powder Grade and Levee Road north of Main Grade are closed during this period.
6. Parked vehicles may not obstruct a road, gate or firelane.
7. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of any wildlife management area that has been designated as closed to vehicular traffic.
8. Tracked vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, airboats, horses and unlicensed and unregistered motorcycles are prohibited.
9. Bicycles may be operated only on named roads and designated bicycle trails.
10. A marked footpath called the Florida Trail traverses the area. This trail is open to hikers throughout the year.

HUNTERS AND CHECK STATIONS:

1. Hunters shall enter and exit the area at a designated entrance and only during hours a check station is in operation.
2. Hunters shall check in or out at a check station when entering or exiting the area, and check all game taken.
3. Hunting equipment and dogs may be taken onto the WMA after 8 a.m. the day before the opening of a season and shall be removed on the last day of each season.
4. No deer or wild hog shall be dismembered until checked at a check station.

5. Check station hours are 5:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. during Eastern Daylight Saving Time and 5 a.m. to 8 p.m. during Eastern Standard Time, except during the small game and wild hog-dog seasons when hours are **5:30 a.m.** to 8 p.m.

GUNS:

1. All firearms shall be securely encased and in a vehicle, vessel, camper or tent, during periods when they are not a legal method of take. Persons in possession of a valid Concealed Weapon or Firearm License may carry concealed handguns.
2. Target practice is prohibited.
3. Hunting with a gun and light is prohibited.
4. Muzzleloading guns used for taking deer must be .40 caliber or larger, if firing a single bullet, or be 20 gauge or larger if firing two or more balls.
5. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.
6. No person shall have a gun under control while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
7. For hunting non-migratory game, only shotguns, rifles, pistols, bows, crossbows or falconry may be used. **Hunting during the spring turkey season with firearms other than shotguns or using a shot size larger than #2 is prohibited.**
8. For hunting migratory game, only shotguns, bows, crossbows or falconry may be used. Shotguns shall not be larger than 10 gauge and shall be incapable of holding more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined.
9. Firearms using rimfire or non-expanding, full metal jacket (military ball) ammunition are prohibited for taking deer.
10. Fully automatic or silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices and set guns are prohibited.

DOGS:

1. Hunting with dogs is prohibited, except bird dogs are allowed during all seasons and any dog may be used during the wild hog-dog season.
2. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of wildlife by the use of dogs is prohibited.
3. Dogs on leashes may be used for trailing wounded game.
4. For purposes other than hunting, dogs are allowed, but must be kept under physical restraint at all times. During non-hunting periods, the possession of dogs shall only be as authorized by the Southwest Florida Water Management District.

CAMPING:

1. Camping is allowed by permit only and only within the site designated on the permit.
2. Campers must submit electronic applications for camping permits at county tax collectors or at www.wildlifelicenses.com (select "Florida," and then "Quota Hunt Permits"). Applicants must be 18 years of age or older to apply and are limited to one camping permit per season. Camping permits are issued by random draw (see worksheets for additional instructions and information). Application periods are: **August 3-15, 2011** (archery); **September 27 – October 10, 2011** (general gun); **November 17-27, 2011** (small game, State Road 471 campground only); **November 17-27, 2011** (wild hog-dog, Rock Ridge campground only); **January 19-30, 2012** (spring turkey); and **March 9-21, 2012** (fishing and frogging, Rock Ridge campground only). A worksheet with a list of available permits may be obtained 1-2 weeks before each application period from FWC offices, tax collectors, and at MyFWC.com.
3. Camping permits are non-transferable. Camping permit holders may allow others to camp within their site; however, the permittee is responsible for the assigned site.
4. Camping equipment may be taken onto the WMA after 8 a.m. on the first date listed on the camping permit. Camping equipment must be removed by 8 p.m. on the last date listed on the camping permit.
5. Tampering in any way with official markings of campsites is prohibited.
6. Only tents, trailers or self-propelled camping vehicles may be used for camping.
7. Unless contained in mobile campers kitchen stoves, refrigerators and freezers are prohibited. Lumber, sheet metal and other building materials are also prohibited.
8. The use or operation of electrical generators powered by an internal combustion engine is prohibited from 10 p.m. until 4 a.m.
9. A legible copy of the camping permit or the permittee's name and permit number must be visibly affixed to camping shelters.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS: During quota hunts, host hunters and guests must share all bag and possession limits.

1. Deer - Daily limit 2, possession limit 4.
2. Wild hog - No size or bag limit.
3. Turkey - Daily limit 1, season limit 2, possession limit 2.
4. Gray squirrel, quail and rabbit - Daily limit 12, possession limit 24 for each.
5. Raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk and nutria - No bag limits.
6. Bobcat and otter - Possession limit 1 unless in possession of a Trapping License.
7. Migratory birds - See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

ARCHERY SEASON:

October 15 through November 13 (Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays only).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Daily quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, archery permit, deer permit (if hunting deer), wild turkey permit (if hunting wild turkey) and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).

Legal to Hunt - Any deer (except spotted fawn), wild hog, turkey of either sex, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.

Regulations Unique to Archery Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply. Hunting with firearms or crossbows (except by disabled crossbow permit) is prohibited, except that centerfire shotguns are allowed for hunting migratory birds when one or more species are legal to hunt (see Migratory Bird section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet).

GENERAL GUN SEASON:

November 19 through January 15.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting during first 9 days) or daily quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, deer permit (if hunting deer), migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds), and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Hunt - Deer with at least one antler 5 inches or more in length, wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter beginning December 1.

Regulations Unique to General Gun Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

SMALL GAME SEASON:

January 21 through February 19 (Saturdays and Sundays only).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Daily quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds), and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Hunt - Wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria, bobcat, otter and migratory birds in season.

Regulations Unique to Small Game Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting is allowed throughout the area. Please note that wild hog-dog season will be open outside the Cumpresso Unit **February 11-19**.
2. Only the State Road 471 check station will be open during the **January 21 through February 5** hunts. The State Road 471 and Rock Ridge Road check stations will be open during the **February 11-19** hunts.
3. Hunting with centerfire rifles is prohibited.

WILD HOG-DOG SEASON:

February 11-19 and February 25 through March 4 (Saturdays and Sundays only).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit, hunting license, management area permit and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).

Legal to Hunt - Wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter through March 1.

Regulations Unique to Wild Hog-dog Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting wild hog with dogs is prohibited in the Cumpresso Unit (see map) west of Levee Road **February 11-19**.
2. Each wild hog-dog quota permit allows a hunting group of two persons and a guest (3 total) to participate in the hunt.
3. Hunting with more than three free-running dogs per hunting group is prohibited.
4. The State Road 471 and Rock Ridge Road check stations will be open during the **February 11-19** hunt. Only the Rock Ridge Road check station will be open during the **February 25** through **March 4** hunt.
5. Persons participating in the wild hog-dog season may use centerfire rifles.

TRAPPING: Prohibited.

SPRING TURKEY SEASON:

March 17 through April 22.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting during first 2 days) or daily quota permit, hunting license, management area permit and wild turkey permit.

Legal to Hunt - Bearded turkey or gobbler.

Regulations Unique to Spring Turkey Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Legal shooting hours are ½ hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.
2. Hunting other animals is prohibited.
3. **Hunting with firearms other than shotguns or using a shot size larger than #2 is prohibited.**

MIGRATORY BIRD SEASONS:

Rails, common moorhen, mourning dove, white-winged dove, snipe, duck, geese, coot, woodcock and crows may be hunted during seasons established by the Commission for these species that coincide with the archery, general gun, small game and wild hog-dog seasons.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit or daily quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit, and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Hunt - See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

Regulations Unique to Migratory Bird Seasons - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations and Migratory Bird Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting duck, geese and coot with lead shot is prohibited.
2. Centerfire shotguns are allowed for hunting during established area seasons when one or more migratory birds are legal to hunt.

FISHING AND FROGGING:

Allowed year round.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Fishing license (not required when frogging).

Legal to Take - See Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations Summary.

Regulations Unique to Fishing and Frogging - All General Area Regulations and General Freshwater Fishing Regulations shall apply.

1. Access for fishing and frogging is restricted to foot traffic only, except during periods open to hunting and May 5 through June 17 (Saturdays and Sundays only). Stanley Fish Hole, Orange Lake and Tillman Lake roads will be open to vehicular traffic during the May-June fishing season. Tanic Grade, Powder Grade and Levee Road north of Main Grade are closed during this period.
2. During the May-June fishing season, vehicular access is allowed at the designated entrance on Rock Ridge Road only and during daylight hours only.
3. Shooting frogs is allowed only during the listed open hunting seasons and only with the legal methods of take during each particular season.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. Water in wells is not certified for human consumption.
2. Information for persons with disabilities can be found at MyFWC.com/ADA.

SOUTHWEST FLORIDA WMD RULES AND INFORMATION:

All persons using the area should become familiar with the status of control burning areas on a daily basis. These areas will be posted at the check station. Please do not park vehicles or leave any equipment in or adjacent to these areas.

COOPERATION REQUESTED:

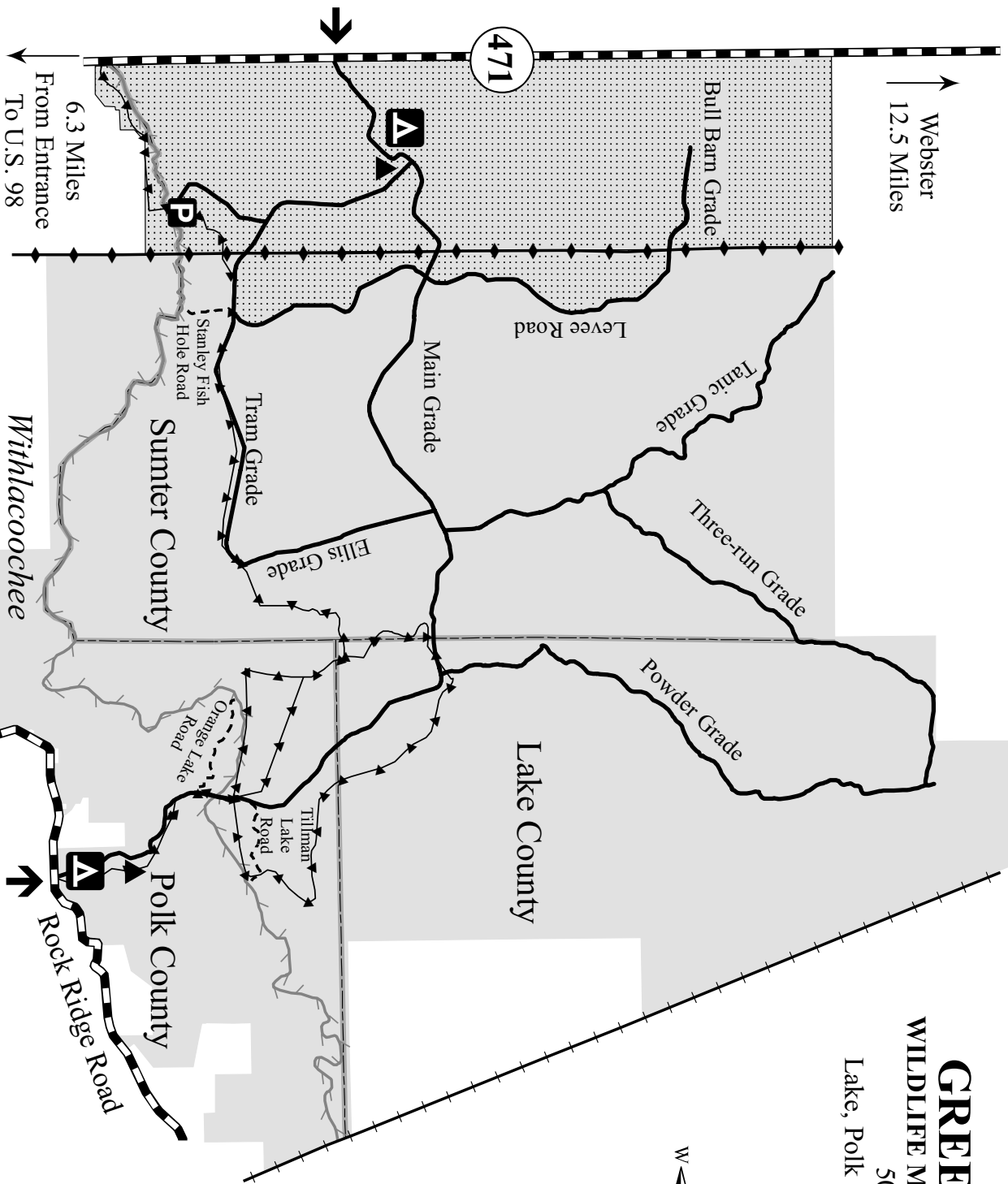

Disorientation is a common problem among persons walking in the swamp. Individuals are encouraged to be familiar with the area they plan to travel and possess minimal survival equipment - compass, flashlight, matches, etc.

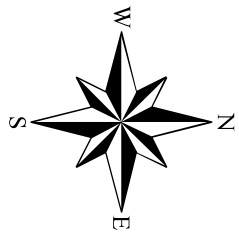

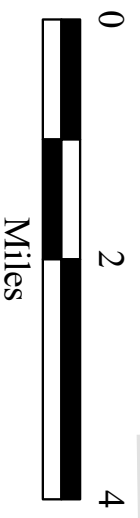


GREEN SWAMP
